

Over the past five years, the Chick-fil-A Cherokee County Moo've it 5k has grown to become one of the largest road races in North Georgia. This race provides a morning of fun, activities and entertainment for the entire family! This year, more than \$65,000 was raised to support CCEF and the Cherokee County Special Olympics.

Annual Golf Classic

Each October the CCEF Golf Classic provides a great chance for golfers to play an excellent course and network with other CCEF supporters. This year, the Annual Golf Classic was sponsored by ABM and held at the Bridgemill Athletic Club. The tournament raised over \$27,000 to support the students and staff of Cherokee County.

In the fall, CCEF launches an enormous t-shirt sale for students, staff and supporters of the district. Every school or department that participates is eligible to receive a grant for a portion of the funds raised by t-shirt sales. We challenge t-shirt supporters to wear their shirt during travels and present an award to the campaign participant who travels the furthest distance. So far, CCSD has made it to every continent in the world!

Celebration of Education Gala

The CCEF Celebration of Education Annual Gala is a wonderful black-tie evening of fun in recognition of past and present staff and students. The Gala was held at the Northside-Cherokee Conference Center and presented by Children's Healthcare of Atlanta. The gala raised more than \$80,000! All of the proceeds are returned to the students and staff of CCSD through our grant programs.


